Enhance evidence-based accountable leadership and management of humanitarian action.



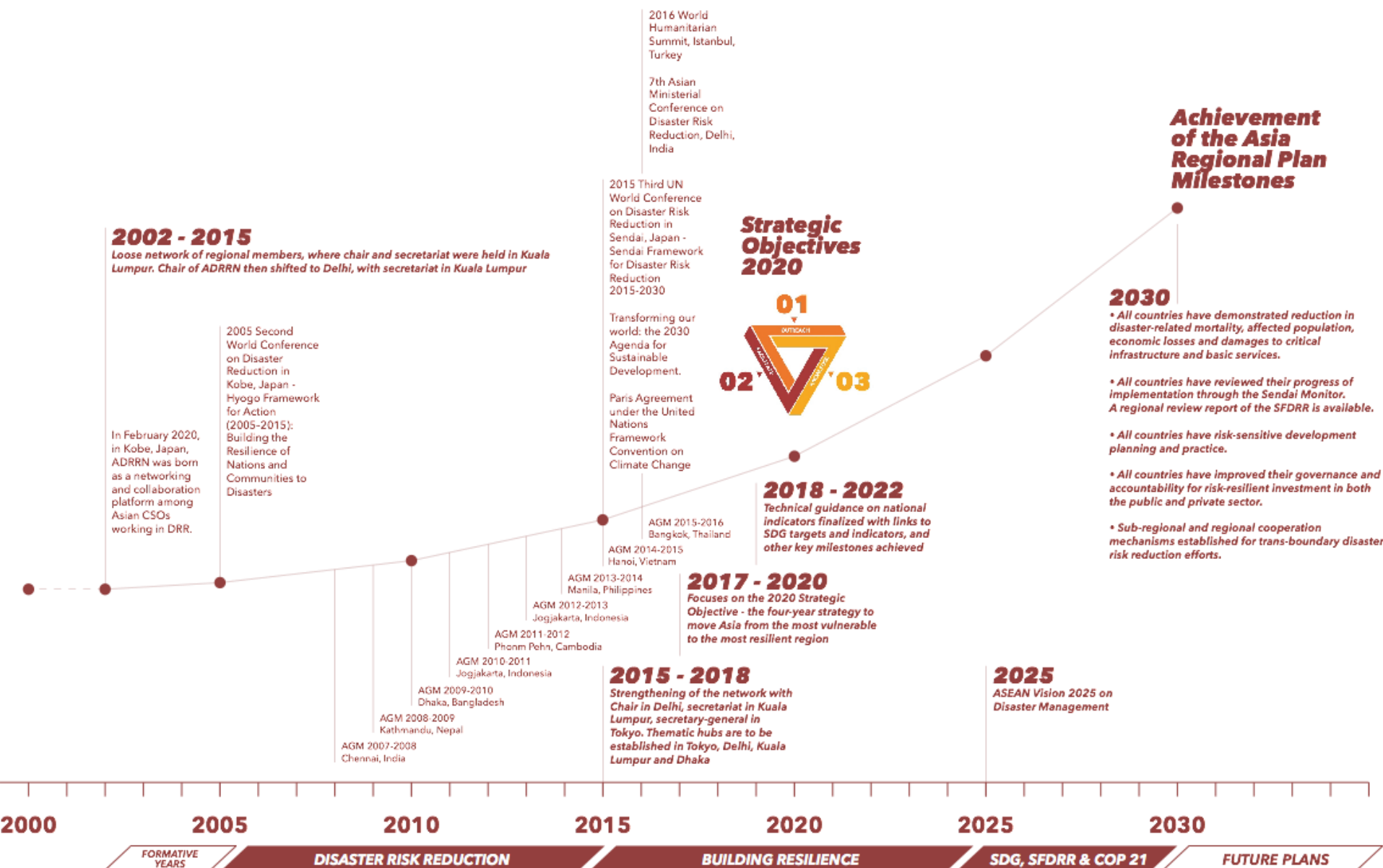

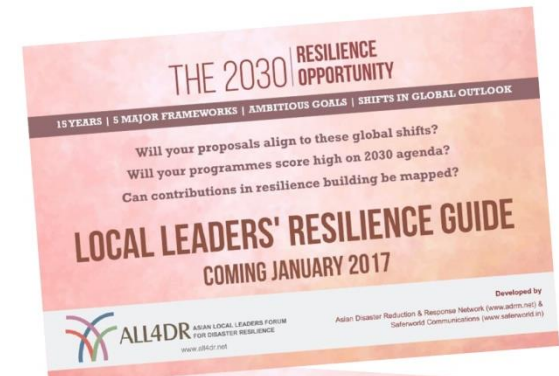
