- Examination of the power structures within various layers of humanitarian and development work and gain insights into how power dynamics impact the efficiency and effectiveness of project implementation
- Collective identification of strategies to address power inequities leading to more transformational equitable partnerships and inclusive practices.

### **Localising Accountability?**

- Experience Sharing about how to implement accountability practices that are not one-size-fits-all but tailored to the unique needs and sensitivities of local communities
- Examine challenges at local level in application of accountability standards and tools.
- Discuss if compliance requirement are a burden or value addition.
- Identify ways to galvanize a local advocacy movement centered on quality and accountability, aiming for more effective and inclusive humanitarian efforts.
