



Why This Training Matters?

In today's fast-evolving humanitarian landscape, overlapping crises, from climate shocks to conflict, we must deliver responses that are inclusive, locally led, and adaptive. Across the Asia-Pacific, the needs and rights of older people and persons with disabilities are often overlooked in emergencies due to a lack of age and disability inclusive responses. This training introduces the Humanitarian Inclusion Standards (HIS), a practical framework aligned with the Core Humanitarian Standard (CHS) and Sphere Handbook, to ensure no one is left behind.

What You'll Walk Away With?

By the end of the training, participants will be able to:

- Understand the critical importance of age and disability inclusion in humanitarian response.
- Navigate the structure and core principles of the Humanitarian Inclusion Standards (HIS).
- Identify and apply the nine HIS standards for including older people and people with disabilities across programme cycles.
- Use the Age and Disability Organizational Assessment Tool to foster inclusive practices within your organisation

Who is This For?

This training is open for all, but we believe it would be particularly useful for Inclusion Advisors, Programme Managers, Technical Coordinators (e.g., Protection, Health, Livelihoods), and MEAL staff. Full attendance and commitment to sharing learning within your organisation are required.
