The Aftermath

The cyclone left a trail of devastation; damaging homes, sweeping away livelihoods, and destroying livestock and small income sources that families relied on for survival.

For households already living in fragile conditions, the disaster deepened uncertainty. Many now face limited access to food, income, and opportunities to rebuild their lives.

Women-Led Households Among the Hardest Hit



Widows and women-led households, with limited financial resources and fewer livelihood opportunities, struggled to provide daily meals, support their children, and regain stability.

- Relief packages containing dry rations and other household essentials**
- Seed Capital**
