With a team of 25 experts, HELP Logistics collaborates with more than 30 organisations across sectors to address critical humanitarian supply chain challenges.

ASIA PACIFIC HUMANITARIAN LOGISTICS WORKING GROUP

Launched in June 2024, the Asia Pacific Humanitarian Logistics Working Group (APHLWG) brings together supply chain and logistics focal points from 22 organisations, including donors, humanitarian agencies, academia, the private sector, and regional disaster management bodies. Co-led by the Logistics Cluster Asia Pacific, the Working Group provides a platform for information sharing, collaboration, and identifying common logistics priorities to strengthen humanitarian programme delivery and enhance local response capacities.
